There is such elegance and beauty to the unique way the teachings are articulated through each of us. The commitment to learning and practicing the Diamond Approach we see each day is inspiring, leaving us with enormous gratitude for how the teaching supports our unfoldment.

At the same time, the findability of the teaching is becoming increasingly important in the world today. Our efforts in this realm have led to many new groups forming in Europe, the United States, Canada and, now, in Asia. New online book and inquiry groups are meeting. Diamond Approach Online courses have grown in number and expanded through outreach. Our new Introduction to the Diamond Approach alone reached more than 300 new students in these various ways of engaging with the teaching have been profoundly transformative for people around the world. Khalisa, a student from Arkansas, recently shared with us:

"I'm really grateful that the Diamond Approach has been offered online because I thought I was going to have to wait a couple years before I could do this work and that I'd have to travel. This has made it possible for me to do preliminary work, now. In my inquiry group people are accessing deeper and deeper states and connecting with themselves and with others in a much more real, open and compassionate way. Every time I go back into my inquiry group or do another online course, there's just this deepening and dawning of this sense that I have access to everything I ever have been drawn towards, in terms of spirit, and life, and unity, and connection. I'm so excited to be on this path!"

We want more people like Khalisa to be able to find the Diamond Approach and to participate in the kind of transformative work with which we are already familiar.
